Unordered Lists

To create an Unordered List (a list with bullet markers) , use the `` `` container. Between the ul container use `` `` for each list item.

The ul stands for Unordered List and li means List Item. Easy enough.

EXAMPLE OF AN UNORDERED LIST

Code View

```
<ul>
<li>Asia</li>
<li>Africa</li>
<li>Europe</li>
</ul>
```

Browser View

- Asia
- Africa
- Europe

It's the li container (working under the direction of the ul container) that makes bullets.

Use an **unordered list** when the order of the list items is **not relevant**. In this list the continents could have been listed in any order.
